STUDENT MEDICATION

Sweatshirts and hoodies are not enough to keep warm during our cold mornings. Jackets can be any color/pattern as they will be worn outside of the classroom only. If you need help getting a winter coat for your students, please call the front office. Snow boots are required only if there is snow on the playground; otherwise, normal footwear is fine.

DRESS CODE REMINDER

We require students to adhere to our uniform dress code. Solid-color polo shirts in the school colors—red (not maroon), white, or navy blue are acceptable, as are Heritage polo shirts which are available in the office for \$12 each. Slacks, shorts, jumpers, capri pants, and skirts in khaki or navy blue can be worn, but no other "bottom" colors are permitted. Uniforms should not be either excessively baggy or too tight.
